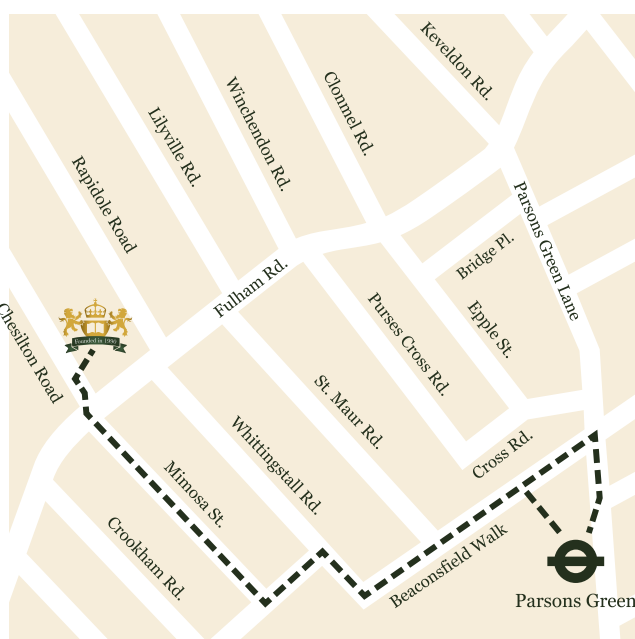

We can arrange 1, 2 and 3 bedroom apartments in safe, residential locations in West and Central London with easy access to the school by public transport.

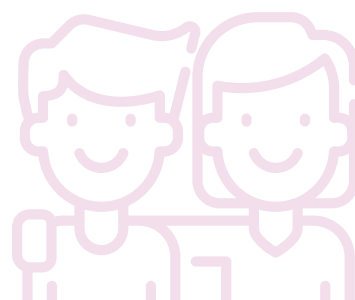
